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STILL PROJECT JUDGING INFORMATION

Shooting Sports Project Judging: Sunday, July 9th CLOSES JULY 5TH

Interviews begin at 1 p.m. and will be scheduled out every 10 minutes. After their interview, youth will complete a test which will cover parts and terminology.

Once testing is complete youth will move outside to begin their hands-on portion where they show proper handling and shooting techniques.

Youth must be interviewed for their shooting sports project on July 9th to include interview and hands-on portion to be eligible for Ohio State Fair. Make-up interviews are available upon request and are NOT eligible for state fair.

Still Project Judging: Wednesday, July 12th CLOSES JULY 7TH

The process will be the same as last year. Qualtrics link to schedule interview times will be available on June 20th. Miami County will be following the same requirements as Ohio State Fair. These requirements can be found on the "2023 Project Completion Requirements" document attached to this newsletter broadcast.

Youth must be interviewed for their project on July 12th to be eligible for Ohio State Fair. Make-up interviews are available upon request and are NOT eligible for state fair.

2023 4-H Cultural Immersion Project -Puerto Rico (Youth) November 21-29, 2023



The 2023 4-H Cultural Immersion Project - Puerto Rico applications are open. The experience is from November 21 – November 29, 2023. After receiving the application, follow-up interviews will be scheduled to select participants. Final selections will be posted in mid-August. 4-H youth ages 15-18 (as of date of trip) are encouraged to apply. Teens must still be in high school as of the date of the trip to participate.

The cost is \$1,400. (This includes airfare, ground transportation, most meals, lodging, and program fees)

Deadline to Apply: July 14, 2023

Teens will experience both the vibrant Old San Juan urban area as well as life in the remote mountain town of Castañer. The group be working with Puerto Rican 4-H members in joint service projects as well as leading a team building workshop for students at University Gardens High School in San Juan. Outdoor recreation as well as daily cultural activities will challenge them to expand their worldview and examine their bias and stereotypes.

Community Service Challenge

The 2023 Miami County Community Service Challenge details are ready!

As discussed during Advisor Trainings, Jessica Adams is challenging each club to select one of the three locations to complete community service this year. Clubs must have 90% attendance when working on a chosen service project. Remember community service is a requirement in all books and a project completion expectation every year in 4-H. If your club already does community service at one of these sites, we are challenging you to come up with an additional idea at a second location.

Friendly reminder, if supplies need to be purchased each club will need to discuss options, make a motion, and vote before purchases can be made. All discussion and transactions must be reflected in the secretary's minutes. The treasurer's report will need to list expenses as well once money is spent. Receipts need to be kept for auditing purposes and reimbursements can only be made to those who fill out a form and submit it with a copy of the receipt. No tax will be reimbursed.

Please have all club news reporters write a summary of what was completed, when it was completed and include photos of the project. Not only is this for historical purposes for your club but it also gives us the opportunity to spotlight the work our clubs are doing. It is time to take "our hands for larger service" and support these three 4-H entities we are so lucky to have in our county. We are excited to see what you all come up with this year!

SERVICE PROJECT OPPORTUNITY

LOOKING FOR WAYS TO HELP YOUR CLUB, COMMUNITY, COUNTRY AND YOUR WORLD?

Consider helping by stenciling storm drains within Miami County residential areas. These messages on neighborhood storm drains help educate individuals not only about how they can help improve water quality in their neighborhood, but throughout the entire watershed.



WHY STENCIL STORM DRAINS? Because toxic materials entering storm drains are damaging our water quality.

Each year people pour hazardous chemicals, pesticides, paints, detergents, paint chemicals, antifreeze and used motor oil down storm drains. Wastes such as street litter, cigarette butts, animal feces, leaves, and grass clippings are often dumped on the ground or into storm drains. When it rains, these wastes are taken directly to the nearest stream, river or lake. Storm water runoff is said to account for up to 80% of the pollution in some of our waterways.

Part of this problem is linked to citizens being unaware that the water that enters storm drains flows directly to rivers and streams, and is not directed to be treated for pollutants the way household sewage is treated. So, when it rains, the storm water carries all sorts of wastes directly into the local streams, rivers and lakes. For example, it has been estimated that one pint of oil can cause a slick about the size of two football fields on calm water.

By participating in a Storm Drain Stenciling Project you are helping to send a message about a relatively unknown pollution problem and, at the same time, suggesting appropriate actions that can be taken to combat the problem.

4th H Club Challenge



We pledge our "health to better living" but do we actually practice it? The 4th H Club Challenge encourages Ohio 4-H Clubs to learn, practice, and advocate for healthy choices and behaviors at 4-H club meetings. Practicing healthy habits and choices now has lifelong effects on the health of youth.

Each club that completes the challenge before the deadline will enter into the \$100 voucher drawing for their region to use for their club (project books, educational tools, etc.)! Each region will have a winner. The first 25 clubs that complete the registration and pre-survey will get an extra entry. How does it work? Apply 3 healthy practices per meeting at 6 or more 4-H clubs/meetings from April - December 2023.

- 1. Register and complete pre-survey.
- 2. Record the dates and activities in the 4th H tracker link. (the tracker link will be provided after registering)
- 3. Share a picture of your club doing a healthy practice on social media. Be sure to include the official hashtag #Ohio4thHClubChallenge.
- 4. Submit all activities to the tracker link by December 31st, 2023.





Workshop details

- 4-H Shooting Sports workshops are provided to train Ohio 4-H volunteers interested in serving as shooting sports discipline instructors in their county 4-H Shooting Sports programs.
- Participants must be approved 4-H volunteers in order to participate in workshops.
- Full participation in the weekend workshop is required. A minimum of 15 training hours.
- Participants must complete the online National 4-H Shooting Sports e-Learning Modules, prior to attending the workshop. These modules only need to be completed one time.
- · Registration Deadlines are final.
- Minimum numbers are required for each discipline to be offered.

- Payment is due at the time of registration
- Space is limited in disciplines -Your space is NOT confirmed until payment is received.
- Cancellations made prior to the deadline date will receive a refund minus a processing charge of \$5.00.
- Cancellations made on or after the deadline will not receive a refund. However, workshop fees may be transferred to another approved 4-H volunteer in the same discipline with advanced notice, for the same workshop.
- Registration Fees will NOT be carried forward to the next workshop.

Junior Leaders

- Teens who are 14+ by January 1 of current year, who are interested in assisting with shooting sports in their home county may apply to attend workshops
- Junior Leaders must have completed the 4-H project in their selected discipline before attending the workshop.
- A letter of recommendation from their shooting sports instructor must be sent to the State 4-H Shooting Sports Coordinator. Junior Leaders spaces are limited, and acceptance will be based on leadership skills, maturity level and self discipline.



- Number of Meetings/Events: See the program structure outline on the application for specific numbers of meetings and events. Members are required to attend at least 75% of meetings and events.
 - O Working Events: Members are required to work a number of statewide events at the Ohio State Fair, and elsewhere throughout the state (e.g. Farm Science Review, Achievement Awards Banquet, etc.). Each level of membership differs in the number of events that are required. See the program structure for more information.
- <u>Location of meetings</u>: Meetings are typically held at the Ohio 4-H Center in Columbus, Ohio, but there are
 occasionally instances when they are held elsewhere due to events on Ohio State's Campus. In these instances,
 meetings may be held at locations close to campus area. Refer to the application for the locations for the 2023-2024
 year. Members will be notified prior to a location change.
