QUALITY ASSURANCE

Hats off to the youth that participated in the Quality Assurance Test Outs on Thursday and Saturday! They all did a wonderful job! We had a great turn out but hope to see even more exhibitors take advantage of this opportunity in 2022.

The Ohio Department of Agriculture mandates Quality Assurance (QA) for all youth exhibitors (age 8-18) of market and lactating dairy animals. The ODA requires QA to be completed a minimum of 45 days prior to exhibition. Quality Assurance for 2021 must be completed by June 1, 2021. Miami County is set to order books once a week, so we need your book order requests by 4:00 P.M. on Thursdays to include on that week's order. Kind reminder orders paid via club check are non-tax. Other payments are taxable. Again, Linda will contact you when your books are ready for pick up and cost. If you have guestions, please feel free to contact Linda.
- **Download one for free.** Select from a dozen popular titles in the <u>Perfect Stay-at-Home Projects</u> collection.
